THE WORD OF GOD

Bible Readings Acts 2.14a, 22-32; Psalm 23; 1 Peter 2. 19 - 25

Gospel Reading John 10. 1 - 10

The Good Shepherd and His Sheep

[Jesus said] "Very truly I tell you Pharisees, anyone who does not enter the sheep pen by the gate, but climbs in by some other way, is a thief and a robber. ² The one who enters by the gate is the shepherd of the sheep. ³ The gatekeeper opens the gate for him, and the sheep listen to his voice. He calls his own sheep by name and leads them out. ⁴ When he has brought out all his own, he goes on ahead of them, and his sheep follow him because they know his voice. ⁵ But they will never follow a stranger; in fact, they will run away from him because they do not recognize a stranger's voice." ⁶ Jesus used this figure of speech, but the Pharisees did not understand what he was telling them.

⁷ Therefore Jesus said again, "Very truly I tell you, I am the gate for the sheep. ⁸ All who have come before me are thieves and robbers, but the sheep have not listened to them. ⁹ I am the gate; whoever enters through me will be saved. They will come in and go out, and find pasture. ¹⁰ The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy; I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full.

Reflection

Jesus is speaking to people who know about the sheep and shepherds living in the town and on the surrounding hills. Is Jesus just letting them know that he is knowledgeable about matters ovine, too?

No. It's *because* the people know about shepherding that Jesus is using it as an illustration for what he wants to teach them.

Now, we may not know everything there is to know about New Testament shepherding;

but what we do know, will enable us to receive from Jesus what he is giving as he speaks.

And what Jesus wants to give us, is the truth about him;

for when he says, "I am the shepherd," he is speaking about himself.

"I walk the path you travel, whether smooth or stony, going ahead of you, leading you to safety.

"Listen for my voice; I am calling you out of the world. Hear and respond, come be part of my flock.

"I know you inside out, you are all equally precious to me.

"I will keep you safe and fulfilled within my flock, you will know safety and plenty.

So, why does Jesus say, "I am the Gate."?

What else does he want us to learn about him? Let's make our way to the rough sheepfold on the hillside, where we see the shepherd lying across the opening in the stone walls; he is the only way in or out

And so, when Jesus says, "I am the gate,"

he's telling us that only through him,

can we enter into God's fold.

Jesus the Gate is also the Shepherd who calls us out,

leading us to all we need to thrive and grow as we follow him.

WE MAKE OUR RESPONSE

Consider the word GATE

In just one word God shows us that:

God Accepts and Treasures Everyone,

God loves unconditionally,

Accepts us as we are,

Treasures us as his precious children,

Everyone, not just some.


"I am the Gate," says Jesus, "it is only through me that you can enter God's fold."
