First Reading

The Ascension

⁶ So when they [*Jesus and the Disciples*] had come together, they asked him, "Lord, will you at this time restore the kingdom to Israel?" ⁷ He said to them, "It is not for you to know times or seasons that the Father has fixed by his own authority. ⁸ But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth." ⁹ And when he had said these things, as they were looking on, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight. ¹⁰ And while they were gazing into heaven as he went, behold, two men stood by them in white robes, ¹¹ and said, "Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking into heaven? This Jesus, who was taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven."

¹² Then they returned to Jerusalem from the mount called Olivet, which is near Jerusalem, a Sabbath day's journey away. ¹³ And when they had entered, they went up to the upper room, where they were staying, Peter and John and James and Andrew, Philip and Thomas, Bartholomew and Matthew, James the son of Alphaeus and Simon the Zealot and Judas the son of James. ¹⁴ All these with one accord were devoting themselves to prayer, together with the women and Mary the mother of Jesus, and his brothers.

Gospel Reading John 17; 1 - 11

Reflection

He has to go; they have to let Him; God's messengers confirm it, Stop looking up; start looking around; find a new 'normal'.

When He walked the earth, Jesus could be in only one place at any one time; now, through His followers' deeds and words, He is everywhere, all the time.

Knowing they are in for another life-change, the men come down from the mountain and spend time together in prayer, waiting to discover the next step, looking for opportunities, seeking their new 'normal'. It has been a whirlwind three or so years. Since meeting and joining with Jesus, leaving behind their 'normal' lives; witnessing His miracles, seeing His signs, hearing His words; experiencing the heartwrenching pain of His death, the overwhelming joy of His resurrection and now saying, 'Goodbye'; their lives will never, can never, be 'normal' again.

Yet they are not down-hearted. Jesus has prayed for them [see today's Gospel], He promised to be with them until the ends of the earth [Matthew 20:28], He said He will send the Holy Spirit to strengthen them [John 14:26]. Jesus keeps his promises and the rest as they say, is history; HIS story.

We, as individuals and the whole world, face a new 'normality'. We can never, must never, seek to return to the way things were before the terrible virus struck. For the sake of the world, we have opportunities before us to reconsider our stewardship of the earth, our relationships and care for others, our demonstration of God's love for all. We are in for another life-change...

Whether that means writing to politicians or signing petitions regarding their actions, standing up for those in need, practically helping others in different ways, adjusting the way we behave, consume, live; or whatever we feel is right, may we undergird our deeds and words in prayer, act in His name and share His love in the world.

We can be assured that Jesus prays for us, is with us at all times and strengthens us with His Spirit.

The Ascension marks an ending, a leaving, a, 'Good-bye'; it also marks the beginning of the future; quite what that future is, is now down to us.

Alleluia! Christ is risen. He is risen indeed. Alleluia!



WE MAKE OUR RESPONSE

Let us affirm our faith in Jesus Christ the Son of God.

Though he was divine, he did not cling to equality with God, but made himself nothing. Taking the form of a slave, he was born in human likeness. He humbled himself and was obedient to death, even the death of the cross. Therefore God has raised him on high, and given him the name above every name: that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, and every voice proclaim that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father. Amen.
