A READING FROM THE ACTS OF THE APOSTLES (2.1-13)

When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them.



All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability. Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem. And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each. Amazed and astonished, they asked, 'Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own native language? Parthians, Medes, Elamites, and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and Arabs – in our own languages we hear them speaking about God's deeds of power.' All were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, 'What does this mean?' But others sneered and said, 'They are filled with new wine.'

The Lord is here. **His Spirit is with us.**

Be with us, Spirit of God; nothing can separate us from your love. Breathe on us, breath of God; fill us with your saving power. Speak in us, wisdom of God; bring strength, healing, and peace.

GOSPEL READING

Alleluia, alleluia. Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful people and kindle in them the fire of your love. **Alleluia.**

John 7:37-39

On the last day of the festival, the great day, Jesus stood up and cried out, "Let anyone who is thirsty come to me, and let the one who believes in me drink. As the scripture has said, 'Out of the believer's heart shall flow rivers of living water'". Now he said this about the Spirit, which believers in him were to receive; for as yet there was no Spirit, because Jesus was not yet glorified.

Reflection

In his post-resurrection appearances, Jesus promised his disciples that, once he was gone, he would send the Holy Spirit to be with us, for ever. Our first reading describes the momentous event when this promise was fulfilled.

The Gospel reading takes the form of a "flashback" to when Jesus was in the Temple, not during the week of his passion, but on an earlier occasion, at the Festival of Tabernacles, when the people remembered their time in the wilderness after escaping slavery in Egypt. For seven days during the festival a priest would lead a procession from the Pool of Siloam carrying a golden pitcher of water to the Temple, where it would be poured out on the altar to recall the time when Moses had struck a rock in the desert and water had poured out to quench the thirst of the people.

Imagine, then, the scene John describes, on the eighth and final day of this Festival. The Temple would have been packed; and the story of God empowering Moses to bring forth water from a rock very much in the forefront of people's minds. Suddenly, Jesus stands up and cries out in a loud voice that, if anyone is thirsty, they should come to <u>him</u> and drink. Moses may have brought holy water out of a barren rock in the arid heat of the desert, but here is Jesus proclaiming to everybody present that he actually <u>is</u> the holy, living water of life. The spiritually thirsty should not look back to the story of Moses to quench their thirst but to him, physically present in their midst, and now spiritually present in ours.

"Whoever believes in me", Jesus said, "streams of living water will flow from him". John explains that Jesus meant that believers would be filled to overflowing by the living water of the Holy Spirit. But, John says, the Spirit had not yet come because Jesus had not yet been glorified. The scene, therefore, looks forward to the day of Pentecost when, as the resurrected Jesus had promised, the Spirit did, indeed, come and fill the disciples to overflowing. From them the Spirit poured out in streams of living water to all those thousands who heard and were converted.

If, then, we truly believe and trust in Jesus, we too will be filled with the Holy Spirit and streams of living spiritual water will pour forth from each of us, manifesting itself in all that we say and do.

So, let us pray:

Lord, help our unbelief And fill us to overflowing with the Holy Spirit; That your Spirit will flow out from us In streams of living water, So that all with whom we come into contact Will come to know you Through us. Amen.
