## **Bible readings:**

Jeremiah 20; 7 – 13

THE WORD OF GOD

Psalm 69; 7-10, 16-18 Romans 6; 1b-11

**Gospel:** 

Matthew 10; 24 - 39

Jesus is speaking with his 12 disciples before sending them to the Jewish people, to tell them the 'Kingdom of God is near'. They are to heal the sick, raise the dead, cleanse lepers and drive out demons. They are to take nothing with them. He says.....

<sup>24</sup> "A disciple is not above his teacher, nor a servant<sup>a</sup> above his master.<sup>25</sup> It is enough for the disciple to be like his teacher, and the servant like his master. If they have called the master of the house Beelzebul, how much more will they malign<sup>®</sup> those of his household.

#### Have No Fear

<sup>26</sup> "So have no fear of them, for nothing is covered that will not be revealed, or hidden that will not be known.<sup>27</sup> What I tell you in the dark, say in the light, and what you hear whispered, proclaim on the housetops. <sup>28</sup> And do not fear those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul. Rather fear him who can destroy both soul and body in hell.<sup>29</sup> Are not two sparrows sold for a penny?<sup>a</sup> And not

one of them will fall to the ground apart from your Father. <sup>30</sup> But even the hairs of your head are all numbered. <sup>31</sup> Fear not, therefore; you are of more value than many sparrows. <sup>32</sup> So everyone who acknowledges me before men, I also will acknowledge before my Father who is in heaven, <sup>33</sup> but whoever denies me before men, I also will deny before my Father who is in heaven.

#### Not Peace, but a Sword

<sup>34</sup> "Do not think that I have come to bring peace to the earth. I have not come to bring peace, but a sword. <sup>35</sup> For I have come to set a man against his father, and a daughter against her mother, and a daughter-in-law against her mother-in-law. <sup>36</sup> And a person's enemies will be those of his own household. <sup>37</sup> Whoever loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me, and whoever loves son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me. <sup>38</sup> And whoever does not take his cross and follow me is not worthy of me. <sup>39</sup> Whoever finds his life will lose it, and whoever loses his life for my sake will find it.

#### Setting the scene

I invite you to take a moment to ponder how you feel – just now / during these past months of lockdown / generally about things in life. At times these can be difficult thoughts; often easier to avoid and carry on. Yet this is a safe space, so please linger as long as you need.... Humanity can be double-edged; we are made in God's image, yet that image is damaged by our words and deeds.

Some people are glass half full, others half empty. Some see themselves as superior, others inferior; nowadays, the second is likely the more common feeling. Especially if we have been alone for weeks now; missing those we love, the hugs and quality time with them. We may, understandably, be feeling low.

#### Reflection

During a recent 'phone call with my Mum, I watched the birds in the vege-garden, surrounded by shrubs and trees, with feeders and the bird table. As we chatted, visitors included robins, doves, various tits, finches of all shades, the new siskin family, wren, starlings teaching their brood how to rule the food table, blackbirds and by far the most prevalent, sparrows. Occupying every nest box, coming in from all directions, they are of course welcome; but not overly interesting with their boring, brown/grey plumage and tuneless chirp. And I have to protect vegetable sowings from their dust bathing, then seedlings from their nibbling.

Whatever our view, Jesus is positive; sparrows are cherished and protected by God. In Jesus' time they were so numerous as to be a nuisance, sold as cheap food for the poor, according to Matthew two for one coin, while Luke records Jesus saying five for two coins – a price reduction for quantity; yet even the 'free' one known by God.

In the midst of this alarming passage, Jesus reminds us of our Heavenly Father's feelings for us, 'You are of more value than many sparrows'. Made in His likeness, He knows all the hairs on our heads [on average 100,000, apparently]. Jesus reminds us of the most frequent command in the Bible, 'Fear not'.

When sending out the disciples to share the news of God's Kingdom, Jesus says will be like sheep amongst wolves; he says

too, whatever happens, they will not be abandoned – He doesn't say they won't have trouble - they will; but they won't be forsaken.

As Jesus speaks to them, He speaks to us. 'Do not be afraid', because God takes special care of us. He sees the sparrow when it falls - He numbers the hairs on our heads.

Life will not always be good for anyone; we, as perhaps now, won't always feel great. Knowing Jesus doesn't give immunity from sleepless nights, trouble, sickness, suffering, even death. Knowing Jesus does mean we are never alone, abandoned or forsaken; He is in it, whatever 'it' is, with us.

Tiny sparrows, seemingly worth so little, yet God cares for each one. We are each worth far more than a host / quarrel / tribe of them, and we know this for Jesus didn't die for sparrows; He died and rose again for us, proving his complete love for us.

A love to give us...

- ... confidence in confusion
- ... freedom from fear
- ... hope in sorrow
- ... peace in this world and the next
