"Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is close at hand". So let us turn away from our sin and turn to Christ, Confessing our sins in penitence and faith.


We reflect in silence, then say together:

Genesis 25: 21 - 34

Isaac prayed to the Lord for his wife, because she was barren; and the Lord granted his prayer, and his wife Rebekah conceived. The children struggled together within her; and she said, "If it is to be this way, why do I live?" So she went to inquire of the Lord. And the Lord said to her,

"Two nations are in your womb, and two peoples born of you shall be divided; the one shall be stronger than the other, the elder shall serve the younger." When her time to give birth was at hand, there were twins in her womb. The first came out red, all his body like a hairy mantle; so they named him Esau. Afterward his brother came out, with his hand gripping Esau's heel; so he was named Jacob. Isaac was sixty years old when she bore them. When the boys grew up, Esau was a skillful hunter, a man of the field, while Jacob was a quiet man, living in tents. Isaac loved Esau, because he was fond of game; but Rebekah loved Jacob. Once when Jacob was cooking a stew, Esau came in from the field, and he was famished. Esau said to Jacob, "Let me eat some of that red stuff, for I am famished!" (Therefore he was called Edom.) Jacob said, "First sell me your birthright." Esau said, "I am about to die; of what use is a birthright to me?" Jacob said, "Swear to me first." So he swore to him, and sold his birthright to Jacob. Then Jacob gave Esau bread and lentil stew, and he ate and drank, and rose and went his way. Thus Esau despised his birthright.

Colossians 3: 12 - 17

As God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience. Bear with one another and, if anyone has a complaint against another, forgive each other; just as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive. Above all, clothe yourselves with love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony. And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in the one body. And be thankful. Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly; teach and

admonish one another in all wisdom; and with gratitude in your hearts sing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs to God. And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him.

THE GOSPEL

John 15: 8-17

My Father is glorified by this, that you bear much fruit and become my disciples. As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you; abide in my love. If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love. I have said these things to you so that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be complete. "This is

my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends. You are my friends if you do what I command you. I do not call you servants any longer, because the servant does not know what the master is doing; but I have called you friends, because I have made known to you everything that I have heard from my Father. You did not choose me but I chose you. And I appointed you to go and bear fruit, fruit that will last, so that the Father will give you whatever you ask him in my name. I am giving you these commands so that you may love one another.

REFLECTION



Our service began by recognising us as the chosen people of God: but what does that really mean?

The Epistle last week was taken from the letter to the Ephesians which told us that God chose Christians (1) before the foundation of the world and (2) that we were chosen to be holy and blameless before God in love.

What does it mean to have been chosen before the foundation of the world ? In the letter to the Colossians we are reminded that Christ is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation; for in him all things in heaven and on earth were created, things visible and invisible (Col 1: 15-16). We were chosen, then, by and for the eternal Christ who, as the Prologue to John's Gospel tells us, was with God in the beginning and <u>is</u> God.

In the Old Testament story of Esau and Jacob. Jacob, the younger twin, swindles his brother out of his birthright and, later, deceives his own elderly, blind father into believing that he is conferring his blessing on Esau, when it is actually Jacob impersonating him. Jacob flees from his brother's wrath; but when he eventually returns he is welcomed and forgiven by his brother. Jacob's conduct is morally reprehensible; Esau stands on the higher moral ground. Yet it is Jacob who is chosen by God to be renamed Israel and to become the father of the Israelite nation, the chosen people of God in our Old Testament.

Why was Jacob chosen? Not because he was a better person than Esau: but because he was to play a role in the history of salvation on Earth. God chose Jacob because that was the best way to establish Israel, intended to be a light to the nations, as the prophet Isaiah tells us. So God chose Jacob as the right person to further his mission here on earth and Israel was chosen to further God's mission on earth, to be the spearhead for the eventual establishment of the kingdom. Does this help us to understand why we are now God's chosen people?

With the coming of Christ, <u>we</u> have become the new Israel. So, if we, the church community, have now replaced Israel as the chosen people, we too are chosen as instruments of God's mission on earth.

As we were told in Ephesians: we were chosen to be holy and blameless before God in love. In our reading from Colossians the author addresses us as "God's chosen ones...holy and beloved"; and we are told to clothe ourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, meekness and patience. This is how we are to be holy and blameless before God: to live our lives displaying these qualities. We are to be an example to others: just as Israel was to be a light to the nations. Above all we are to clothe ourselves with love. This is the way we are to further God's mission to bring his kingdom to come on earth as it is in heaven.

In our Gospel reading, Jesus tells us that if we obey his commandments we will abide in his love. And his commandment is simple: love one another, as I have loved you. We are, he says, his friends, because "You did not choose me, I chose you". We are chosen, then, by Christ from before the beginning, to be holy and blameless before the eternal Christ, to love one another and to abide in his love. "I appointed you", Jesus said, "to go and bear fruit, fruit that will last".

Let us then go forth, resolved to keep that commandment to love one another; and by our compassion, our kindness, our humility, meekness and patience, to bear that fruit, fruit which will last, and, by doing this, fulfil the task for which we were chosen, to spread abroad the good news of Jesus Christ.

And help us to bring them to you by our exercise of compassion, mercy, patience and love through which they will see you in all that we say and do.

May the Lord who has gone before to prepare a place for us, receive the souls of the all the faithful and grant us and them, at the end of this life, the perfect knowledge of his love.
