Jesus and John the Baptist

[Jesus speaks to the crowds and says] ¹⁶ "To what can I compare this generation? They are like children sitting in the marketplaces and calling out to others:

"We played the pipe for you, and you did not dance; we sang a dirge, and you did not mourn."

¹⁸ For John came neither eating nor drinking, and they say, 'He has a demon.' ¹⁹ The Son of Man came eating and drinking, and they say, 'Here is a glutton and a drunkard, a friend of tax collectors and sinners.' But wisdom is proved right by her deeds."

The Father Revealed in the Son

²⁵ At that time Jesus said, "I praise you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth, because you have hidden these things from the wise and learned, and revealed them to little children. ²⁶ Yes, Father, for this is what you were pleased to do.

²⁷ "All things have been committed to me by my Father. No one knows the Son except the Father, and no one knows the Father except the Son and those to whom the Son chooses to reveal him. ²⁸ "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. ²⁹ Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. ³⁰ For my yoke is easy and my burden is light."

Reflection

Is this what Jesus is offering us - a single, milkmaid style yoke used to carry milk or any load on a farm? A yoke that will enable us to deal with a burden, all by ourselves, leaving us exhausted?





No, Jesus is thinking of the double, or twin yokes, used in his time for working animals two at a time. Linked in pairs, the two animals sharing the burden of pulling. Jesus would have been somewhat of a yoke expert, his words having authority, for yokes were made by village carpenters, and crafting these vital pieces

of farming equipment would have been part of Jesus' training with Joseph in the Nazareth workshop.

Each yoke was made to measure for each pair of animals - tailor made not one-size-fits-all.

But as well as knowing about double yokes, Jesus would have known about *adjustable* yokes whereby the burden distribution could be altered, so that one animal pulls more if the other tires or is overburdened. Jesus says, "Take *my* yoke upon you," The yoke that Jesus has made for each one of us, a double yoke,

so that we walk with him and he walks alongside us; an adjustable yoke, so that when we struggle, Jesus lessens our share as he walks, yoked beside us, easing our burden.

<u>Thought</u>

There was one burden that only Jesus could bear, a single beam of wood, on one man's shoulders.
