Bible Readings

Matthew 18.21-35 - Forgiveness

²¹ Then Peter came and said to him, 'Lord, if another member of the church sins against me, how often should I forgive? As many as seven times?' ²²Jesus said to him, 'Not seven times, but, I tell you, seventy-seven times.

²³ 'For this reason the kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who wished to settle accounts with his slaves. ²⁴When he began the reckoning, one who owed him ten thousand talents was brought to him; ²⁵and, as he could not pay, his lord ordered him to be sold, together with his wife and children and all his possessions, and payment to be made. ²⁶So the slave fell on his knees before him, saying, "Have patience with me, and I will pay you everything." ²⁷And out of pity for him, the lord of that slave released him and forgave him the debt. ²⁸But that same slave, as he went out, came upon one of his fellow-slaves who owed him a hundred denarii; and seizing him by the throat, he said, "Pay what you owe." ²⁹Then his fellowslave fell down and pleaded with him, "Have patience with me, and I will pay you." ³⁰But he refused; then he went and threw him into prison until he should pay the debt. ³¹When his fellow-slaves saw what had happened, they were greatly distressed, and they went and reported to their lord all that had taken place. ³²Then his lord summoned him and said to him, "You wicked slave! I forgave you all that debt because you pleaded with me. ³³Should you not have had mercy on your fellow-slave, as I had mercy on you?" ³⁴And in anger his lord handed him over to be tortured until he should pay his entire debt. ³⁵So my heavenly Father will also do to every one of you, if you do not forgive your brother or sister from your heart.'

Romans 14.1-12 - Do Not Judge Another

^{14.1}Welcome those who are weak in faith, but not for the purpose of quarrelling over opinions. ²Some believe in eating anything, while the weak eat only vegetables. ³Those who eat must not despise those who abstain, and those who abstain must not pass judgement on those who eat; for God has welcomed them. ⁴Who are you to pass judgement on servants of another? It is before their own lord that they stand or fall. And they will be upheld, for the Lord is able to make them stand.

5 Some judge one day to be better than another, while others judge all days to be alike. Let all be fully convinced in their own minds. ⁶Those who observe the day, observe it in honour of the Lord. Also those who eat, eat in honour of the Lord, since they give thanks to God; while those who abstain, abstain in honour of the Lord and give thanks to God.

⁷ We do not live to ourselves, and we do not die to ourselves. ⁸If we live, we live to the Lord, and if we die, we die to the Lord; so then, whether we live or whether we die, we are the Lord's. ⁹For to this end Christ died and lived again, so that he might be Lord of both the dead and the living.

¹⁰ Why do you pass judgement on your brother or sister? Or you, why do you despise your brother or sister? For we will all stand before the judgement seat of God. ¹¹For it is written,
'As I live, says the Lord, every knee shall bow to me, and every tongue shall give praise to God.'
¹²So then, each of us will be accountable to God.



Reflection

In recent weeks we have been reflecting together on characteristics of the Christian way of life looking in particular at those mentioned in our readings from the letter to the Romans, asking: In view of who we are as the church – the people of God - how then should we live?

And so this week: To be a vegetarian, or not to be? Is that the question? You might be forgiven for thinking so after the reading above, but of course that is just an example not the main issue! The subtitles in the Bible though not a part of scripture, give a clue: 'Forgiveness' and 'do not judge another ' - and you can see why the Lectionary writers have put these passages together, because the two overlap: not judging one another, tolerance, acceptance and forgiveness are interwoven – the one often requires the other.

It starts with how we treat one another in the Church community. 'If another member if the church sins against me how often should I forgive?' The disciples ask. 'Why do you pass judgement on your brother or sister?' Paul asks the Roman believers. Here in the church family is where it is often most difficult to make allowances, to accept those who are different from us, to allow different opinions and ways of doing things, even different beliefs and yet not be intolerant and judgemental. We need to work at it. Yes, hopefully we have many things in common, but these are not necessarily the superficial things. We are not a people who are bound together by being identical or by even by liking the same things, but by the forgiveness of Christ being released in our lives and the love of God in our hearts – both evidenced by and worked out by how we live: including how we treat one another when we don't agree.

Looking to build one another up, considering others better than ourselves, putting the needs of others first and when we get it wrong, as we will, being ready to give and receive forgiveness seventy times seven. We can *choose* to exercise these characteristics to respond in these ways – we won't always succeed of course, but the more we choose them the more we practice them, the more habitual and natural they will become.

Of course there is a line, there are things that we should not tolerate: those things that God calls sin, those attitudes that bring division and hurt and dis-harmony. But we need to be very careful and check regularly that our prejudices are not creeping in to distort our thinking. Thankfully we are never too old to change – it's part of that transformation of our minds that we are both called to and offered, so we can see things Gods way!

And if it starts amongst us here in the church, it doesn't end here. The church is amongst other things a microcosm and a model for life lived in the Kingdom, life lived God's way, and so the kind tolerant, forgiving loving ways that we practise with one another should spillout into our lives in the wider community and model God's kingdom life to the world. Our lives must match up to our message, if we work in partnership with the Spirit they can - to the glory and praise of God.



Prayer of Thanksgiving

O God, we are thankful that you do not see us as others see us, or sometimes even as we see ourselves. So often we are less loving than you are and our judgements are harsh and wounding. We come to you with grateful hearts and celebrate that because you are God, you are more than we can ever be. **Amen** Hymn

And if our fellowship below in Jesus be so sweet, what heights of rapture shall we know when round his throne we meet!


Prayers of Intercession
