representing some of the various forces and conflicts and, at the time of silence, a picture of the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier in Westminster Abbey, whose names none but God knows.

In the same way, trusting He knows each by name, we place in the palm of His hand, all who have lost their lives or health or loved ones because of war.

First Reading

Micah 4: 1 - 8

4 It shall come to pass in the latter days that the mountain of the house of the Lord shall be established as the highest of the mountains,

and it shall be lifted up above the hills; and peoples shall flow to it,

and many nations shall come, and say: 2 "Come, let us go up to the mountain of the Lord, to the house of the God of Jacob, that he may teach us his ways and that we may walk in his paths." For out of Zion shall go forth the law, and the word of the Lord from Jerusalem. ³He shall judge between many peoples, and shall decide disputes for strong nations far away; and they shall beat their swords into ploughshares, and their spears into pruning hooks; nation shall not lift up sword against nation, neither shall they learn war anymore; ⁴ but they shall sit every man under his vine and under his fig tree, and no one shall make them afraid. for the mouth of the Lord of hosts has spoken. ⁵ For all the peoples walk each in the name of its god, but we will walk in the name of the Lord our God forever and ever. ⁶ In that day, declares the Lord, I will assemble the lame and gather those who have been driven away and those whom I have afflicted: ⁷ and the lame I will make the remnant, and those who were cast off, a strong nation; and the Lord will reign over them in Mount Zion from this time forth and forevermore. ⁸ And you, O tower of the flock, hill of the daughter of Zion, to you shall it come, the former dominion shall come. kingship for the daughter of Jerusalem.

Gospel Reading

<u>John 15; 9 - 17</u>

*Jesus said, "*As the Father has loved me, so have I loved you. Abide in my love. ¹⁰ If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love. ¹¹ These things I have spoken to you, that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be full.

¹² "This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. ¹³ Greater love has no one than this, that someone lay down his life for his friends. ¹⁴ You are my friends if you do what I command you. ¹⁵ No longer do I call you servants, for the servant does not know what his master is doing; but I have called you friends, for all that I have heard from my Father I have made known to you. ¹⁶ You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you that you should go and bear fruit and that your fruit should abide, so that whatever you ask the Father in my name, he may give it to you. ¹⁷ These things I command you, so that you will love one another.

Reflection

Thousands of bright red poppy wreathes will be placed at war memorials across the world again this year. Each an unmistakable mark of remembrance; an unbroken ring symbolising strength, honour, respect, and hope that we will live in peace.

Yet, even as the wreathes are placed, wars continue. A normal part of life for millions of ordinary people; destroyed families, orphans, refugees; people just like us; except we live in peace, albeit, at a heightened level of awareness.

Why does war continue? How can a loving God permit nation to revolt against or within nation? Isn't Jesus' message one of love and peace?

Throughout the Bible, there are many war stories and the promise of 'war and rumours of war' until Jesus makes his return and God's Kingdom comes on earth as it is in heaven.

God's Word is clear, 'For I take no pleasure in the death of anyone', declares the Sovereign Lord. So, turn and live! [Ezekiel 18.32]. War is not of the God who creates all life; rather the result of anger, greed, envy, hatred, pride - sinful human actions despised by God.

Yet, the wise King Solomon wrote, 'To everything there is a season, and a time to every purpose under the heaven... 'a time for war, and a time for peace.' [Ecclesiastes 3; 1,8] How can we reconcile a loving God with, 'a time for war'? Is there a purpose? Dare we ever consider a just outcome? Perhaps Defence, Liberation, Judgment?

Christians are called, 'as far as is possible to live at peace with everyone'. War if not for selfish ambition or aggression or vengeance; but there are times when it is necessary to defend one's family or country, or that of a friend, against another who is hostile.

The Bible doesn't prohibit war, Jesus does not speak against it; His peace is not the 'peace at any cost' that the world considers; He does not give as the world gives. 'Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid,' He says, for distinct from social or political peace, Jesus brings an active, spiritual peace, the presence of God. True peace is, as we have read, when They will beat their swords into ploughshares and their spears into pruning hooks.... ...Everyone will sit under their own vine and no one will make them afraid, for the LORD Almighty has spoken.

Today we might say.... 'They will recycle their guns into seed drills and their tanks into harvesters. Everyone will gently sway in their hammock in dappled shade.'

That wonderful image of the tools of war and death being converted into tools of growth, harvest and life. Don't you just long to hear the hammering and bending of metal that will fill the air at that time?

Today we pause to reflect; shamed by the inhumanity of those who seek war and so very thankful to our brothers and sisters who, risking their very lives and health and strength, sought and seek to combat it.

May we hold on to the knowledge that God does not take pleasure in war, but currently it is inevitable, and God allows it, to accomplish His purposes.

In our world, as it is today, there will be war and rumours of war until, one day, 'when' is known only to God, all war will end,. May we look forward in hope, for when God's kingdom comes, wars will forever cease, and peace, through Jesus Christ, will fill every heart and life and soul. Amen
