Bible Readings

Acts 19.1-7

¹⁹While Apollos was in Corinth, Paul passed through the inland regions and came to Ephesus, where he found some disciples. ²He said to them, 'Did you receive the Holy Spirit when you became believers?' They replied, 'No, we have not even heard that there is a Holy Spirit.' ³Then he said, 'Into what then were you baptized?' They answered, 'Into John's baptism.' ⁴Paul said, 'John baptized with the baptism of repentance, telling the people to believe in the one who was to come after him, that is, in Jesus.' ⁵On hearing this, they were baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus. ⁶When Paul had laid his hands on them, the Holy Spirit came upon them, and they spoke in tongues and prophesied— ⁷altogether there were about twelve of them.



Mark 1.4-11

⁴John the baptizer appeared in the wilderness, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. ⁵And people from the whole Judean countryside and all the people of Jerusalem were going out to him, and were baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins. ⁶Now John was clothed with camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist, and he ate locusts and wild honey. ⁷He proclaimed, 'The one who is more powerful than I is coming after me; I am not worthy to stoop down and untie the thong of his sandals. ⁸I have baptized you with water; but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit.'

9 In those days Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan. ¹⁰And just as he was coming up out of the water, he saw the heavens torn apart and the Spirit descending like a dove on him. ¹¹And a voice came from heaven, 'You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased.'



Reflection

The baptism of Jesus marked the start of his journey of public ministry. He hadn't been idle up to this point, but from now on he would start to gather around him those who were willing to hear and receive his transforming message of reconciliation with God and enter into the radical lifestyle of love that he advocated. From now on he would start to speak about the Kingdom rule of God that was breaking into this world and transforming it from within. From now on he would start to demonstrate what God's rule was like by healings and acts of power: powerful signs, symbols of what God wanted to do to put his creation right.

From now on he would be in conflict with the religious leaders of the day who wanted to maintain things just as they were, to hang on to power and who thought they controlled access to God. From his baptism on, Jesus was set on a road that would lead to Jerusalem and the cross – which was meant as a defeat, but which God turned to good: the means by which we might be forgiven and reconciled with him. His baptism was the public start of this journey.

Jesus baptism was also the occasion of the public acknowledgement of his relationship with God. He is not just some slightly wacky individual with strange ideas, but God identifies him as his own, much loved son – he'd always been that of course, but now anyone who cared to listen knew it too. And Jesus, knew that God the Holy Spirit, like the dove that hovered over him, would be with him, guiding him through everything that lay ahead.

At our baptism we were recognised as the sons and daughters of the living God, part of his family, the church. And we too can know that God the Holy Spirit will be with us guiding us through everything that lays ahead of us, this year as always.
