THE PRESENTATION OF CHRIST (CANDLEMAS)



Today we celebrate Jesus as the light of the world, recognised as such by Simeon as he joyfully welcomed this long-awaited child at his presentation in the temple. Subsequently this day became the one when household and church candles were gathered to be blessed for use in the year ahead – hence 'Candlemas'. Traditionally this service marks the end of our Christmas/Epiphany services as we pack away the Crib and turn towards Lent and Easter.

In these dark days of winter and the darkness of the pandemic we look for light to comfort and bring us hope. You might like to gather a variety of candles, large or small, to light as we begin our service – we will use one or more at various points as a symbol of Christ the Light of the World.


Come down, O love divine, seek Thou this soul of mine, And visit it with Thine own ardour glowing.

Reading Luke 2.22-40 Jesus Is Presented in the Temple

²² When the time came for their purification according to the law of Moses, they brought him up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord ²³(as it is written in the law of the Lord, 'Every firstborn male

shall be designated as holy to the Lord'), ²⁴and they offered a sacrifice according to what is stated in the law of the Lord, 'a pair of turtle-doves or two young pigeons.'

²⁵ Now there was a man in Jerusalem whose name was Simeon; this man was righteous and devout, looking forward to the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit rested on him. ²⁶It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not see death before he had seen the Lord's Messiah. ²⁷Guided by the Spirit, Simeon came into the temple; and when the parents brought in the child Jesus, to do for him what was customary under the law, ²⁸Simeon took him in his arms and praised God, saying,

- ²⁹ 'Master, now you are dismissing your servant in peace, according to your word;
- ³⁰ for my eyes have seen your salvation,
- which you have prepared in the presence of all peoples,
- ³² a light for revelation to the Gentiles and for glory to your people Israel.'

³³ And the child's father and mother were amazed at what was being said about him. ³⁴Then Simeon blessed them and said to his mother Mary, 'This child is destined for the falling and the rising of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be opposed ³⁵so that the inner thoughts of many will be revealed—and a sword will pierce your own soul too.'

³⁶ There was also a prophet, Anna the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was of a great age, having lived with her husband for seven years after her marriage, ³⁷then as a widow to the age of eighty-four. She never left the temple but worshipped there with fasting and prayer night and day. ³⁸At that moment she came, and began to praise God and to speak about the child to all who were looking for the redemption of Jerusalem.

³⁹ When they had finished everything required by the law of the Lord, they returned to Galilee, to their own town of Nazareth. ⁴⁰The child grew and became strong, filled with wisdom; and the favour of God was upon him.

Reflection

Women and children not safe in their own homes due to abuse; the prejudice highlighted by the 'Black lives matter' movement, still rife in our society; the inequalities leading to the rise in the need for foodbanks; constant attempts on-line and by phone to scam the vulnerable and unworthy. And then there is this week's shocking and sad milestone of more than 100,000 dead from Covid 19 in our own country alone. How many are grieving around the world? The darkness all around us is only too evident.

And what about within us too; which of us can claim to be all sweetness and light? Aren't there things in all our lives, petty actions, unworthy thoughts and destructive attitudes that we are glad to keep hidden from others? (Or is it only me?)

Old Simeon in our Gospel reading recognised the infant Jesus as 'a light for revelation to the Gentiles and for glory to your people Israel.' Light then for everyone, the Light of all the world!

This light of Christ shines in the dark places of our world and our hearts, illuminating the darkness for what it is and bringing cleansing purity and hope. Showing God's way of love and forgiveness: bringing us hope.

What in these dark days is Christ's light illuminating? The new shoots of spring; the selfless dedication of so many key-workers; wonderful knowledge and hard work resulting in new treatments and

vaccines. Small acts of love and kindness that lift our hearts and spirits.

Pause for a moment and consider what has encouraged you this week?

For me it was a bullfinch visiting my bird-feeder after a long absence; a note of appreciation, and emails from Archdeacon Audrey and the Canon Precentor at the Cathedral saying, 'we are praying for you all', as our churches came-up in the Diocesan prayer-diary. Little things perhaps, but light in the darkness non-the-less: welcome reminders of the love of God in these difficult days.

Jesus *is* the light of the world, bringing forgiveness, wholeness and and hope. So, as we used to say in our childhood games, 'pass it on!' How might you pass on the light of Christ this week?
