# Alleluia! Christ IS Risen!

Dear Friends,

The 8<sup>th</sup> May this year is the historic 80<sup>th</sup> anniversary of VE (Victory in Europe) Day when the nation will celebrate 80 years since the end of the Second World War in Europe. The 15<sup>th</sup> August will be the 80<sup>th</sup> anniversary of VJ (Victory in Japan) Day which marked the final cessation of hostilities when Japan surrendered following the dropping of the US nuclear bombs on Hiroshima and Nagasaki.

While some of us may feel a little ambivalent about celebrating the dawn of the nuclear age in August, we need have no such qualms about celebrating the defeat of Hitler's Germany which, with its appallingly wicked murder of so many innocent Jewish men, women and children, among so many others, is probably the most evil regime that has ever held sway over a significant part of the globe.

World War II was the largest and most violent military conflict in human history. Official casualty sources estimate military deaths at nearly 15 million and civilian deaths at over 38 million.

VE Day 80 is not only a celebration of the triumph over evil and the restoration of peace in Europe but also a tribute to those who fought for the freedom we enjoy today and to those millions of non-belligerent civilians whose lives were prematurely stolen from them. It is a day of both joyful celebration and solemn remembrance. It is tragically ironic that VE Day 80 falls in the third year of the Russo-Ukrainian war, the largest military conflict in Europe since World War II.

At 9am on 8<sup>th</sup> May town criers across the nation will make the VE Day Proclamation; at 12noon, pipers will play a new piece, "Celebratum", from the top of the UK's four highest Peaks; at 6.30pm, Church bells will ring out in unified celebration of the return to peace, and at 9.30pm over 1,000 beacons will shine out as many will gather to sing "I Vow To Thee My Country".

Here in our Benefice, we will gather by the war memorial in the churchyard of **St Julitta's**, **Lanteglos by Camelford** for a brief act of Remembrance at 5.30pm by the war memorial when wreathes will be laid by the Royal British Legion and the Town Council. This will be followed by a special service in church which will conclude as the bells ring out for half an hour at 6.30pm. The celebrations will continue by the bandstand in Camelford later in the evening when a beacon will be lit in conjunction with those being lit across the nation.

There will also be events to mark the occasion at St Teath and Delabole. In **Delabole**, a short time for all in the village to pause, remember and mark the day at 11am. There will be a brief commemoration at the clock tower in **St Teath** at 6.10pm leading up to the ringing of the bells at 6.30pm.

We shared Holy Communion. The Altar was stripped and then followed the Watch, as scriptures were read and silence held.

The Good Friday Walk of Witness started with worship at St Thomas'



Camelford; a good-sized group of people and dogs, walked to St Julitta's, pausing regularly to hear readings of Jesus' final journey and pray for Camelford and its people; forty-four hot-cross-buns were given out along the way. At St Julitta's, we closed with worship.





On **Holy Saturday**, The Service of the Light was held in St Thomas Church. Beginning outside with a fire and Scriptures, we then walked through the church and outside, three times; carrying the light. The final time we stayed inside and shared Holy Communion together.

Our Easter celebrations began as we heard, 'He is not here; he is risen' at 6am in Sunrise Services of Holy Communion at St John's and St Adwena, both followed by breakfast.
